

## **Faculty**

<u>Dr. Alex Smith</u> (jasmith@ucmo.edu) is Associate Professor of Percussion at UCM and the Marching Percussion Coordinator. Smith received his D.M.A. in Percussion Performance at Michigan State University, where he also received his M.A. in Ethnomusicology and M.M. in Percussion Performance; he received his B.M. from East Carolina University. Smith is a nationally and internationally recognized performer, composer, music technologist, researcher, and instrument maker within a wide range of musical contexts.

<u>Dr. Yun Ju Pan</u> is an Adjunct Instructor at UCM. Yun Ju Pan, born in Taiwan, has been featured as a solo and chamber musician in concerts across the globe, including the United States, Taiwan, Japan, China, and Australia. Yun Ju Pan is a multiple award-winning musician. She was the First prize winner in the 2016 Australia Marimba Competition, the Third prize winner in the PASIC 2013 Vibraphone Solo Competition, among many others.

<u>Dr. Ian McClaflin</u> is an Adjunct Instructor at UCM. Ian holds his D.M.A in Percussion Performance from The University of Southern Mississippi where he studied under Dr. John Wooton. He received his M.M. in Percussion Performance from the University of Missouri and holds a B.M. in Percussion Performance from UCM. Ian has many compositions published through C-Alan Publications; a number of these are included on the Missouri state prescribed music list.
