Before your financial aid for the 2025/2026 academic year can be finalized, federal regulations require certain data from your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) be verified for accuracy. For FAFSA Verification purposes, you are classified as Dependent if your parent(s) were REQUIRED to provide their data on your FAFSA. If you were not required to have your parent(s) enter their information on your FAFSA, you will need to complete the FAFSA Verification Worksheet for Independent students. Section A: Dependent Family Information

Dependent Students: At the bottom of this page, list the people in your parent's home including: -You and your Parent(s): include your parent even if you do not live with them. Include your parent's current spouse and include any parent who is temporarily out of the home due to military service. Exclude any parent who has died or is not living in the home because of separation or divorce. -Your siblings: if they live with your parents (or live apart because of college enrollment) and they currently receive more than 1/2 of their financial support from your parents and will continue to until June 30, 2026. -Other persons: if they live with your parents and they currently receive more than 1/2 of their financial support from your parents and will continue to until June 30, 2026. -Do NOT include any unborn children.

IMPORTANT: Students and Parents: As part of the federal student aid eligibility parents, spouses and students are required to consent and approve sharing and importing income and tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA Form, even if the attempt to obtain or use such data is ineffective. In other words, if the parent and spouse or student filed separate 2023 IRS income tax returns or one or both did not file taxes, both must provide consent and approval to share and import income and tax information from the IRS.
